Here is a long list of websites and software to make teaching and learning more interesting and effective. They are tools that can give you a new way of doing something. For example, you can have your students make a mindmap online, edit videos, use critical thinking to complete a puzzle, create a map, or answer quiz questions online. There are also a lot of programs that you can use to help your teaching. They could help you save time, for example organizing test results, sharing documents, or making worksheets and handouts.

For some of these tools you will need fast internet with plug-ins like Flash Player, and for some of them you need to make a free account and sign in.
